The MES Fund was established in 2000 to honor Margaret Elizabeth Stephenson, who dedicated her life to Montessori teacher training. It is the first national financial aid fund to provide scholarships to AMI teacher trainees in the United States.

In 1960, Margaret Stephenson was commissioned to initiate teacher training in the United States on behalf of the Association Montessori Internationale. She conducted training courses in this country for nearly 40 years. This year, the MES Fund is proud to celebrate our 23rd anniversary.

Celebrating Washington Montessori Institute's 60th Anniversary


Founded by Margaret Elizabeth Stephenson, 1962

Montessorians from all over the world gathered in February at The Montessori Experience AMI/USA Refresher Course in Baltimore to celebrate the historic 60th Anniversary of the Washington Montessori Institute.

Founded by Margaret Stephenson in 1962, WMI was the first AMI training center in the United States. This marked the beginning of Montessori teacher training in the US. Many teachers and trainers who were trained by Miss Stephenson celebrated her life's work at the event.

Special guests included Marie Fonseca (Olson), a founding member of the WMI board and part of the first AMI training course in 1962 and Mary Lou Cobb, founding Head of The Cobb School, Montessori, who was trained by Miss Stephenson at WMI, Class of 1963.

AMI trainers Phyllis Pottish-Lewis, Allyn Travis and Judi Orion were trained by Margaret Stephenson and graduates of WMI. Judi graduated with a Primary diploma in 1967, Phyllis earned her AMI Elementary diploma in 1976 and Allyn received her Primary diploma in 1974 and her Elementary diploma in 1980.
